



Screaming Eagle Foundation Surviving Children's Scholarship Program 2017 Immediate Use Scholarship Application

Information: The Screaming Eagle Foundation in partnership with the Patriot Foundation offers secondary education and future use scholarship opportunities for surviving dependent children of Soldiers of the 101st Airborne Division and Fort Campbell units who have been killed or severely wounded since September 11, 2001 in the Global War on Terror.

- Scholarships are to be used for costs of tuition, books or fees at secondary colleges, universities or vocational/technical schools
- Each scholarship will be awarded at the current value (\$2500) of this year's secondary school scholarship awards.
- Applicants will be notified regarding award decisions before June 30th each year. Those who did not receive a scholarship will receive an email of the results. Recipients will receive a letter in addition to an email stating their selection and providing instructions to complete the process
- Recipients will be contacted via email and telephone annually to verify contact information, student's academic progress and current enrollment. The purpose of this is to provide donors or prospective donors with a summary of the program's results. Eligibility:

- Dependent Child/Children, as defined by the United States Armed Services, of active duty personnel who were assigned to the 101st Airborne Division, Air Assault or one of the tenant military organizations assigned to Fort Campbell, Kentucky, with exception of U.S. Army Special Operations Command units, who were killed, wounded or injured while serving in the 101st Airborne Division or other qualifying unit while in support of the Global War on Terrorism on or after September 11, 2001.
- The Global War on Terror includes military operations since September 11, 2001 including Operation Enduring Freedom, Operation Iraqi Freedom, Operation New Dawn, Operation Inherent Resolve, Operation Freedom's Sentinel and subsequent operations as directed by the Department of Defense
- Qualified applicants must be a high school senior or graduate, up to 22 years of age and a full time student. Full time students must be taking at least 12 Credit Hours per semester at an accredited two-year or four-year College, university, post-graduate program or a vocational/technical school.
- Use of awarded funds issued through qualified withdrawals shall include tuition, books or fees required for enrollment or attendance at any eligible institution in the United States and abroad
- **Applications must be neatly printed with exception of signatures, and essays and letters must be typed.** Do not attach any documents or additional pages to the application unless they are required. Any additional documentation submitted, but not requested, will not be allowed to remain with the application and will be disposed of in a manner to protect any sensitive information submitted. Applications received after the deadline of 31 March, 2017 or incomplete applications will not be considered and will be disposed of in a manner to protect any sensitive information submitted.



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Instructions: Before completing the application, please carefully read the eligibility requirements. Each surviving child must have a separate application submitted on their behalf. Incomplete applications will result in delays or ineligibility, so please ensure that all requested information is provided. **Applicants are responsible to ensure all requested information is accurate, provided and received prior to the submission deadline date of March 31, 2017.**

Required Documentation (For Applicants):

1. Proof of service member's assignment to the 101st Airborne Division, Air Assault or other qualifying Fort Campbell, KY tenant unit at the time of death (please block out SSNs on orders)
 - Assignment orders or Deployment orders
2. Proof of service connected disability or death (provide your applicable documents, please block out any SSNs)
 - Casualty Report (DD1300)
 - Purple Heart Certificate or Retirement Certificate
 - M.E.B or P.E.B. Results or VA Disability Rating
3. Proof of dependency (provide applicable documents to establish applicant's dependency, be certain to block out the Service Member's SSN)
 - DEERs Report or Copy of dependent military ID
 - Casualty Report (DD1300)
4. Official transcript and acceptance letter for high school seniors or currently enrolled in a university or other secondary education program
5. Student provides a typed essay, one page in length titled, "What this scholarship means to me."
6. A letter of recommendation from a teacher, guidance counselor, athletic coach or employer attesting to applicant's character, intellect and judgment
7. Photo of Applicant with family and high quality headshot of applicant (.jpeg format preferred) (Those awarded scholarships will be placed on the Screaming Eagle Foundation website and announced as annual winners; photos will not be used in the selection process)

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Essay:

Applicants should provide a one page letter to the Screaming Eagle Foundation titled, "What this scholarship means to me." The essay should be typed and single spaced, using 10-12 point Times New Roman or Arial font. The essay should avoid simply stating the benefits of "pays for tuition or easing a financial burden," as the major premise. The essay should ultimately be based on how the award matters or changes the life of the service member's child and surviving family and be hand signed by the applicant. The following is an example of the possible essay format:

- A brief bio or introduction of the applicant, describe the family, applicant's interests, goals or hobbies
- Provide a brief description of how the Service Member's injury or death has affected the child and family
- Briefly describe what type of challenges or hardships that are faced as a family
- What receiving a Screaming Eagle Foundation Surviving Children's Scholarship would mean to the child and family and how it impacts their future

Statement of Understanding and Release:

I have read the application instructions and eligibility requirements and understand my responsibility to provide accurate and complete information, follow submission procedures and meet the deadline requirements for this application and if awarded, provide follow up information requested. I attest that the applicant is the surviving child of a former 101st Airborne Division, Air Assault Soldier or other qualifying Fort Campbell, Kentucky unit who meets the eligibility requirements for this Scholarship. I also give the Screaming Eagle Foundation permission to use my submitted photographs, essay and our family's story for purposes of promoting The Screaming Eagle Surviving Children's Scholarship. I understand and give permission to the Screaming Eagle Foundation to share our story and photos with their Patriot Foundation partners for use in continuing the scholarship program.
